The Quaker Church started in England in the 1600s because some people did not agree with the main *Protestant Church. The leaders, *George Fox and Margaret Fell, believed that everyone has an "inner light," or a way to feel close to God directly. Quakers, also called the Religious Society of Friends, did not follow formal church *rituals or have priests. Instead, they believed everyone is equal and *worshiped in a simple way.

At first, Quakers were treated badly for their beliefs. They were put in jail or fined because they refused to follow the Church of England's rules, like taking *oaths or paying money to the church. Despite these challenges, Quaker ideas spread quickly in England and America.

Quakers were also important in helping people gain more rights. They wanted everyone to be treated equally, so they were (1) slavery and wanted women to have equal rights too. Quakers built schools and believed everyone should have a chance to learn, *no matter their *gender or background.

Quakers are also known for their belief in peace. They refused to fight in wars or carry weapons. It sometimes caused problems for them. (2), they wanted to help people solve problems peacefully.

Over time, the Quaker Church changed, and some groups followed different ideas. Some stayed more traditional, while (3) became more open to new ways of thinking.

Today, Quakers still care about helping people and making the world a better place. They work <u>to end poverty</u>, protect the environment and support human rights. Even though there are not many Quakers compared to other Christians, they have made a big difference in history with their focus on equality, peace, and helping others. Now, Quaker groups exist around the world and work to make a positive impact.

Soil is very important for life on Earth, but it is in danger. This danger could hurt our environment and our future. The problem is called land *degradation. This means that the land becomes less healthy. It affects soil, plants, and water. Land degradation is a big problem around the world, and we need to pay attention to it. Understanding soil damage, how it happens, and why it *matters is important. *The United Nations has goals, called Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), to help with this problem.

Land degradation means that land quality goes down. Soil degradation is a big worry for scientists and policy makers because it affects farming, animals, and the health of nature. Nature gives us many things we need, like clean air, food, and wood. Soil can be harmed by things like cutting down forests, big farms, building cities, and raising too many animals. When forests are cut down, soil can be washed away by rain. Big farms can make soil lose its *nutrients, which makes it harder to grow good food.

When soil is damaged, it has less nutrients. This is a problem because plants need nutrients to grow. Without good soil, farming becomes harder, and people might not have enough food. Bad soil can also turn into desert land. In Africa, there are projects to stop deserts like the Sahara from getting bigger.

The UN made the SDGs in 2015. One of these goals is called "Life on Land." This goal helps protect forests, *wetlands, and wild places. The SDGs want to stop land from getting damaged and to take care of it in a healthy way.

Learning about soil and land is important to stop land damage. Teaching people about the environment can help them protect the Earth. Schools can include environmental topics, and students can do projects like planting trees, campaigning for using less paper, or promoting eco-friendly goods. This can help young people feel responsible and take action.

Land degradation, especially soil damage, is a big problem for the world. By using SDGs, changing our actions, and teaching young people, we can make a difference.
